Medicaid expansion, wage hike would hurt state

Creating more good jobs in West Virginia will not happen unless our state is made more attractive to businesses. Expanding the size, power and cost of government will make that more difficult.

Analysts at the West Virginia Center for Budget and Policy have released a report on the state of our state's workforce. In many ways the situation is bleak. Unemployment remains at about 7.4 percent. That number will increase if some of President Barack Obama's policies, such as the war on coal, are pursued. In addition, more jobs than in the past come without health insurance or pension benefits, the center found.

Statistics reported by the center are illuminating in regard to the nature of employment in the Mountain State. More than half the jobs here are in government, trade, transportation, utilities, education and health services.

Government jobs provide more than 20 percent of the total nonfarm employment in our state, the center found. That is substantially higher than the national average.

Center analysts made several recommendations for improving the economy and thus, providing more and better jobs.

Some of those ideas make sense - but others would expand the cost of government enormously. That would siphon more money from the private sector, making West Virginia less, not more attractive to the manufacturers our state needs badly.

Expanding the state Medicaid program, as mandated under the

national health care law, would add around \$180 million a year to the state budget - which already is in trouble. Spending cuts of 7.5 percent for most state agencies have been ordered by Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin, merely to keep the budget balanced.

Other suggestions by the center, such as selling bonds to improve the state's infrastructure, also would increase the cost of government.

Another recommendation, increasing the required minimum wage, would hurt existing businesses and, in all likelihood, force them to reduce employment.

State legislators have attempted for years to provide tax relief that could attract more businesses to West Virginia. Putting more pressure on the budget, as recommended by the center, would make that virtually impossible. In that light, the group's suggestions should be viewed skeptically.
