Within the last 10 years, the number of lawyers willing to serve as Court Appointed Counsel for criminal defendants (both misdemeanor and felony), Juvenile Abuse and Neglect, Guardians ad Litem, and Juvenile criminal matters has gone from an estimated 63 to 11. Kanawha County is currently in a situation where indigent defendants are in imminent danger of being denied their basic Constitutional rights and children have no representation in situations of abuse and neglect.

Court-appointed cases offer a unique opportunity including, but not limited, to:

- Make a profound difference in the lives of others.
- Gain significant practical courtroom experience.
- · Contribute to the equitable administration of justice in our community.
- Make a difference in the lives of vulnerable children.
- Gain experience and develop skills in various areas of the law.
