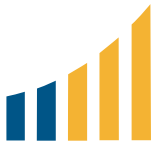

2024 KIDS COUNT Data Book

KIDS COUNT is a joint effort by the Annie E. Casey Foundation and the West Virginia Center on Budget and Policy which provides an annual snapshot of the well-being of West Virginia children statewide and on a county-by-county basis. This data helps to inform policymakers, advocates, and the general public about the current strengths and needs of West Virginia children and helps provide a path forward for policy change to improve the lives of all children.

West Virginia's 55 counties vary widely in child well-being.

In addition to demographics, income, and poverty data, the county factsheets include data under four key categories: education, health, economic, and family and community. Statewide data is also included for comparison. **Before diving into county-specific factsheets, here is a look at the well-being averages of children statewide.**

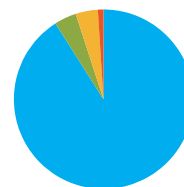
West Virginia as a whole ranked 44th in overall child well-being when compared with all other states in the 2024 KIDS COUNT Data Book.

The county level data presented here reinforce the importance of policy decisions on the well-being of West Virginia's children. While state and federal policymakers have prioritized child and family health during and following the pandemic, policies that would increase economic stability and improve educational outcomes have not been adequately addressed. West Virginia policy makers must recognize the inherent link between poverty and overall well-being to truly address the needs of the state's children and families.

Overall, **25 percent of children in West Virginia lived in poverty**, or with a household income below \$23,030 for a family of three. **The median household income in the state was \$54,329.** Median household income measures the income of the typical household—or the household in the middle of the income distribution—and serves as a good indicator for how the middle class is faring.

One in five children in West Virginia were food insecure, or did not have enough to eat and did not know where their next meal would come from.



EDUCATION

West Virginia has 245,047 children enrolled in public schools. 46.6 percent of 4th graders were proficient in reading, while 28.7 percent of eighth graders were proficient in math. The graduation rate for the 2023 four-year cohort was 92.6 percent. 19.7 percent of students had a disability.



HEALTH

2.6 percent of children under the age of six lacked health insurance, while **47.4 percent of children were insured through Medicaid**, the joint state and federal government program that provides health insurance to low-income children and adults. There were 17,189 live births in West Virginia in the most recent year of data available, with 12.8 percent of births were pre-term, or happening before the 37th week of pregnancy.



ECONOMIC

66,412 children were participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, also known as SNAP. In addition, there were 8,654 households with children that received TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) assistance. 62,000 children under the age of six had all available parents in the workforce.



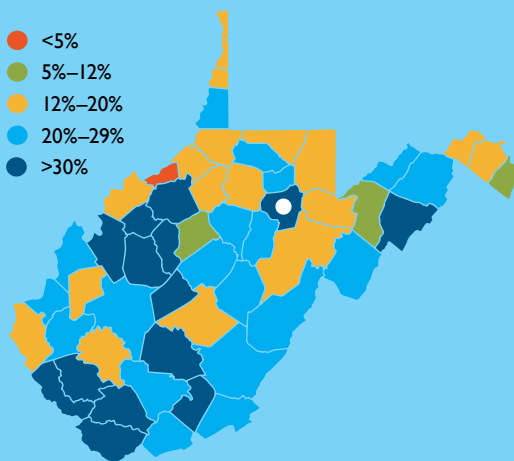
FAMILY & COMMUNITY

On average **11,991 children received child care assistance monthly, while there was a child care gap of 24,855.** The child care gap was measured by taking the number of children under age six with all available parents in the workforce compared to the number of child care slots in the state. There were 5,967 children in state custody as part of the child welfare system. The rate of children with Juvenile Criminal System Involvement was 5.78 per 1,000 children.

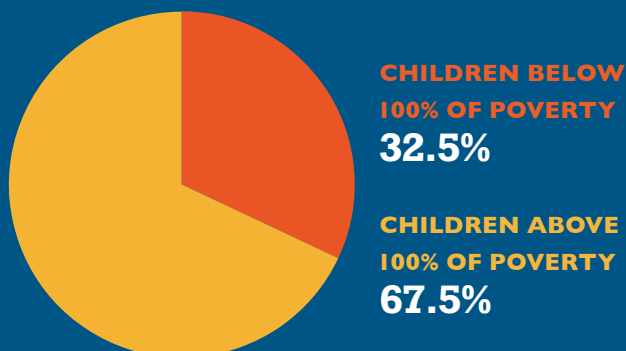

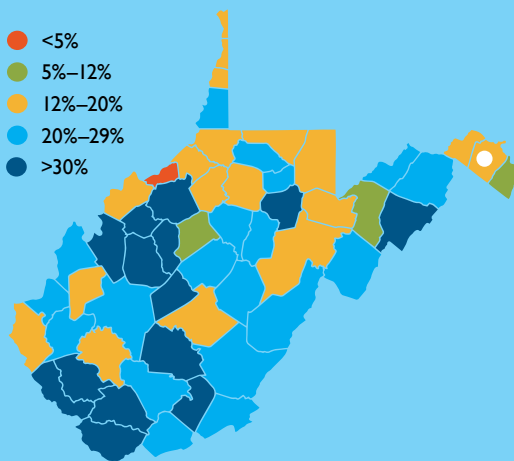

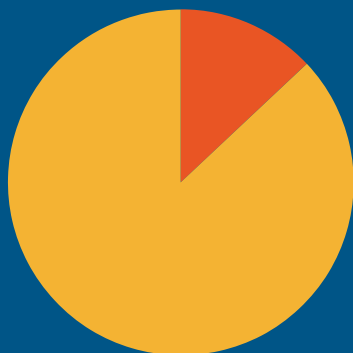

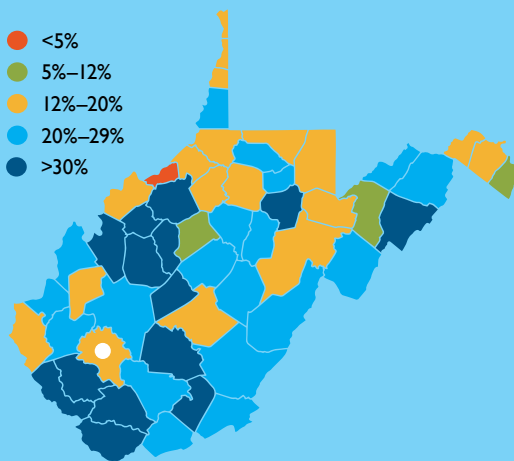

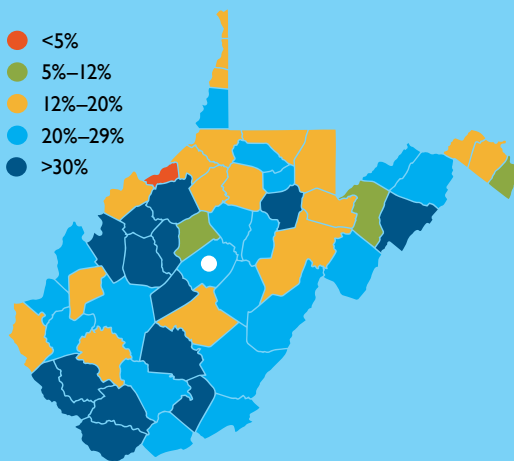

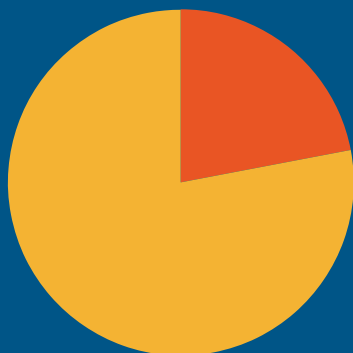

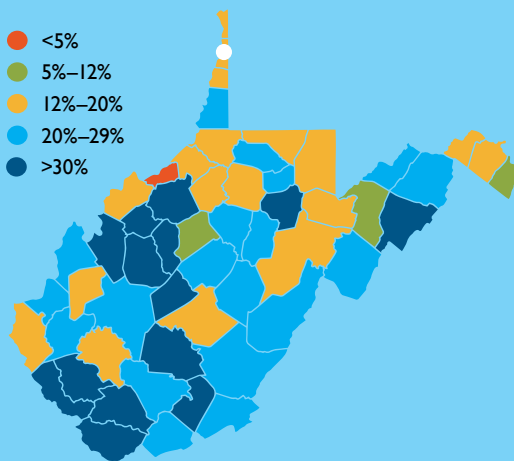

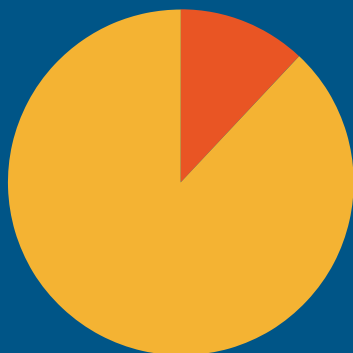

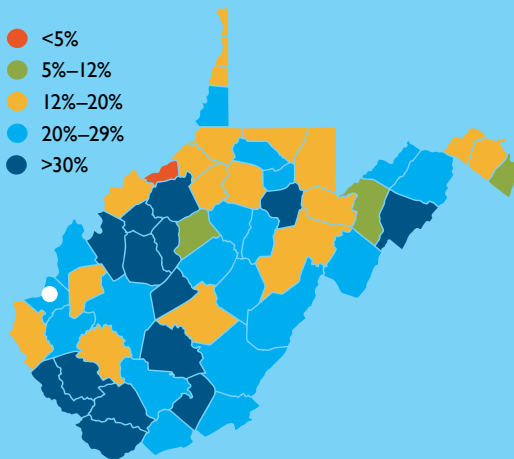

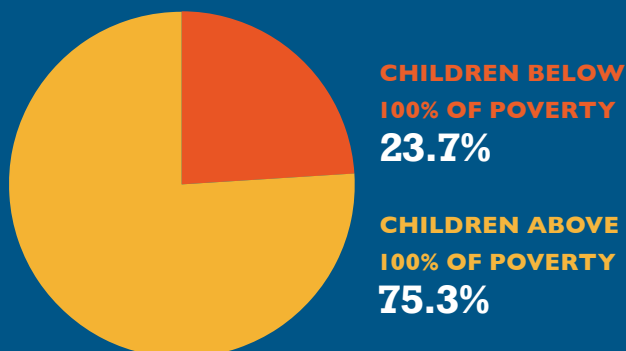

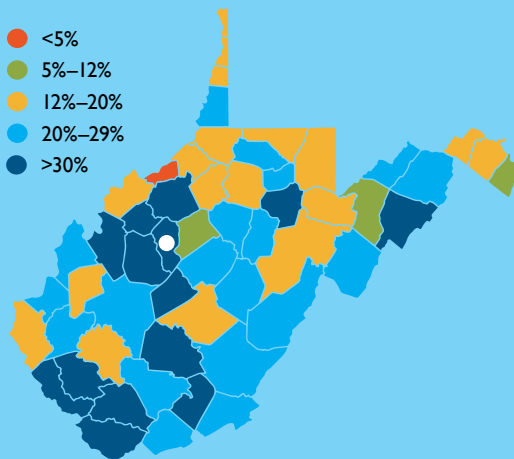

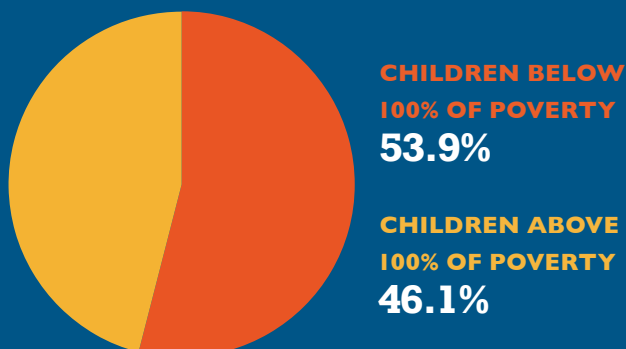

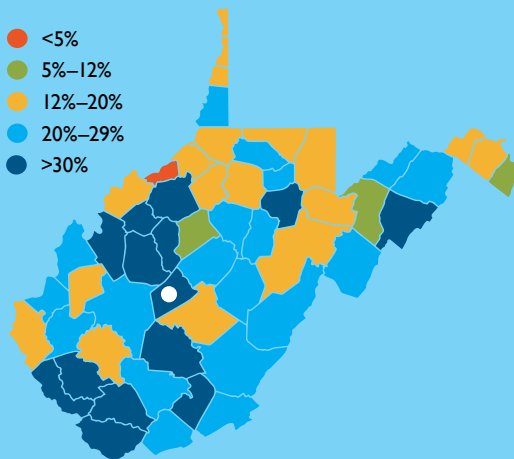

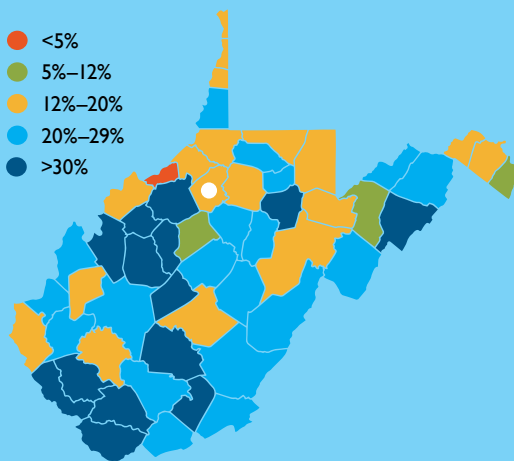

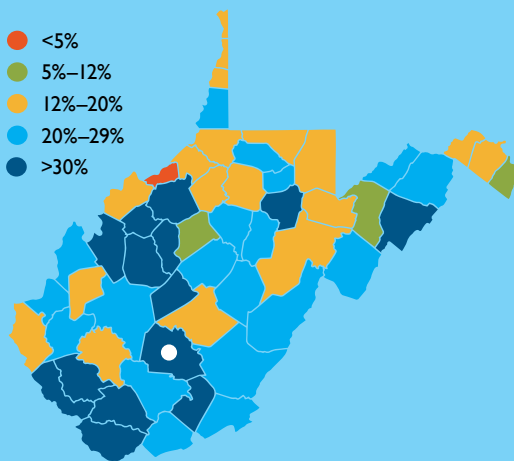

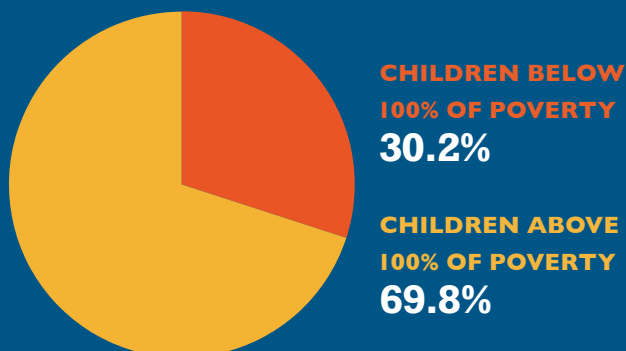

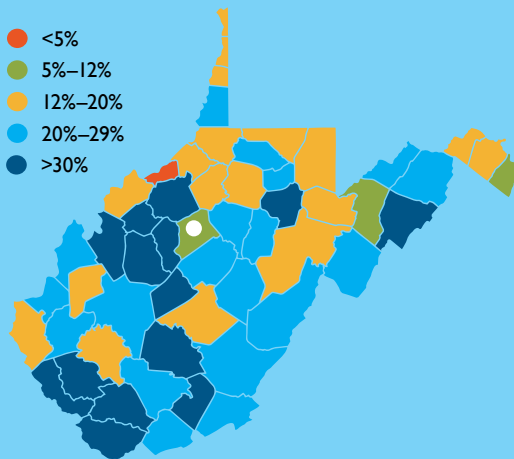

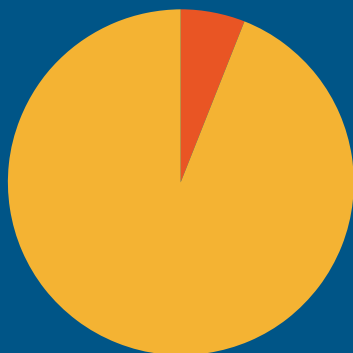

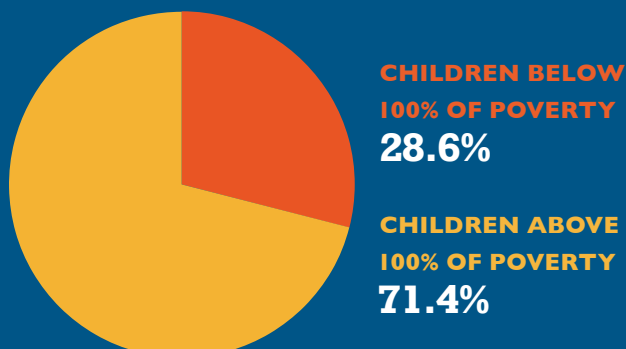

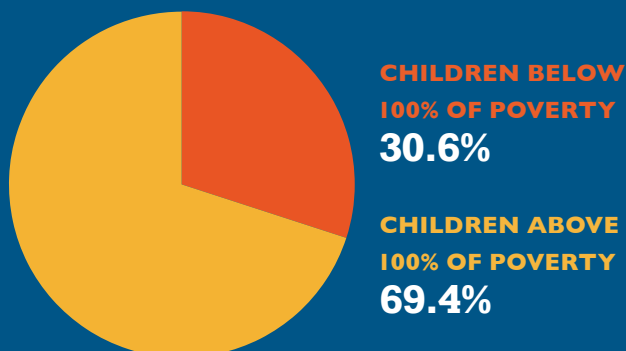

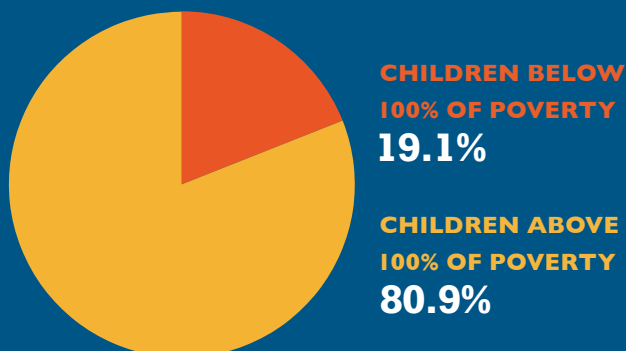

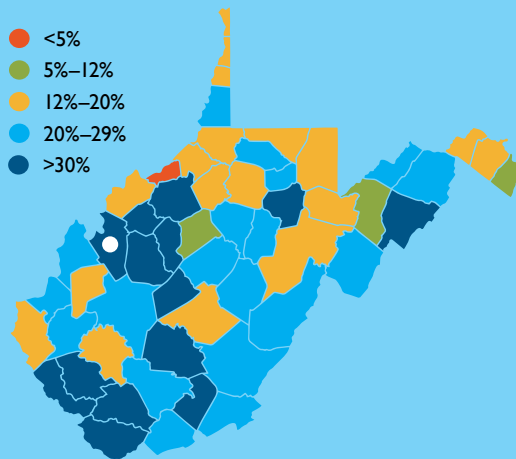

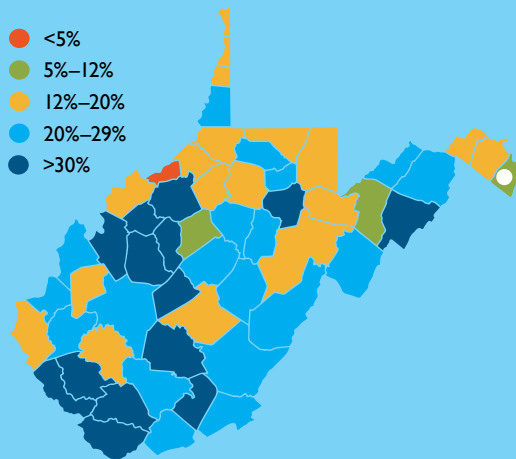

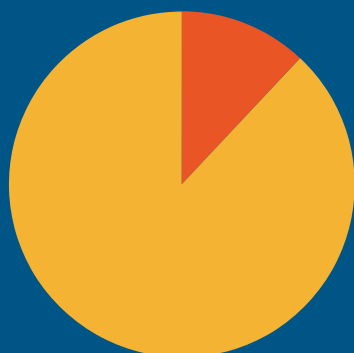

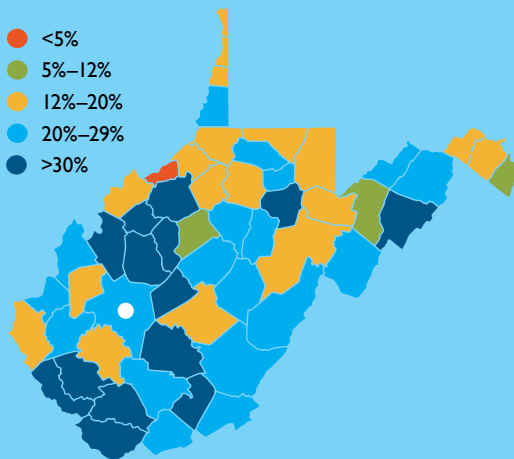

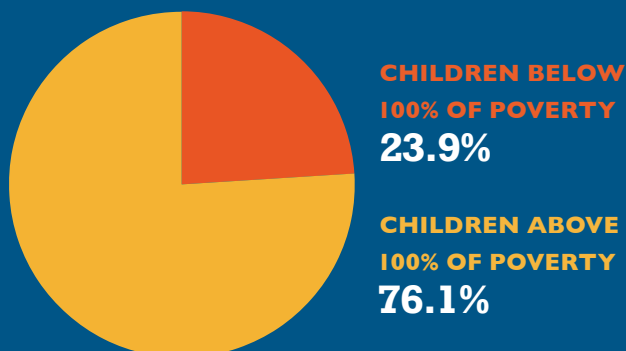

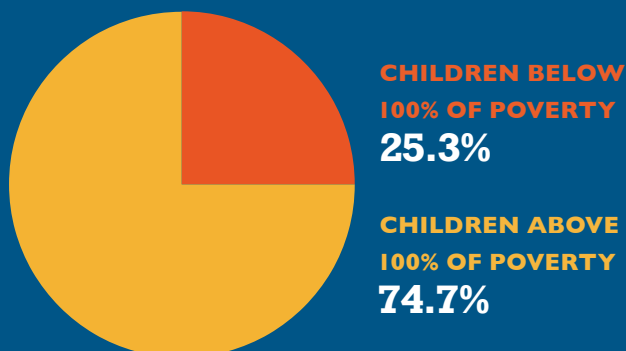

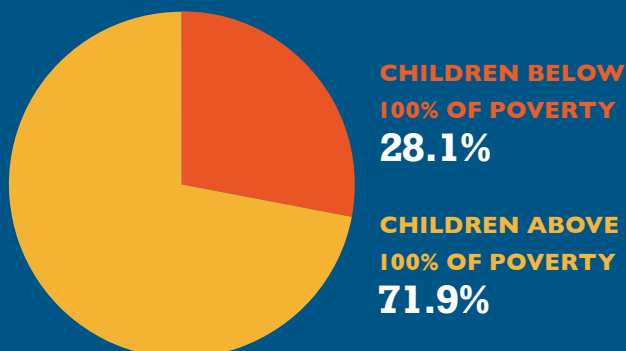

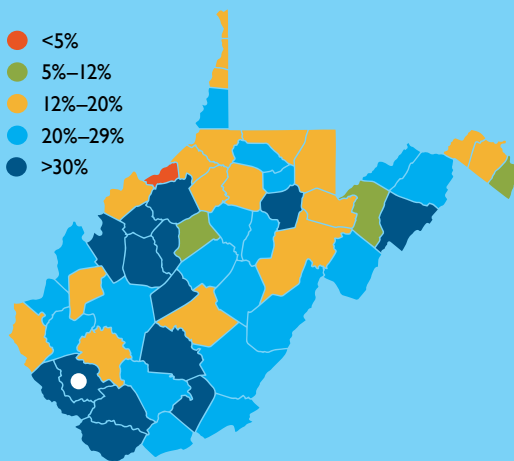

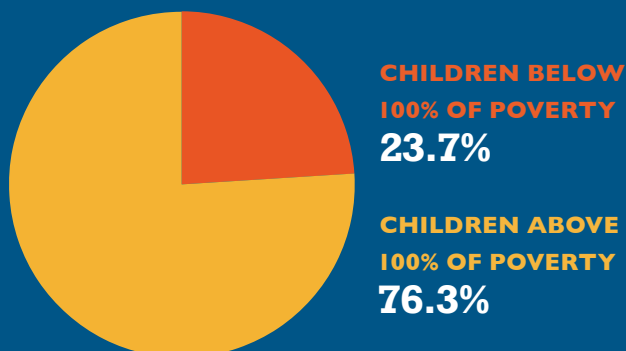

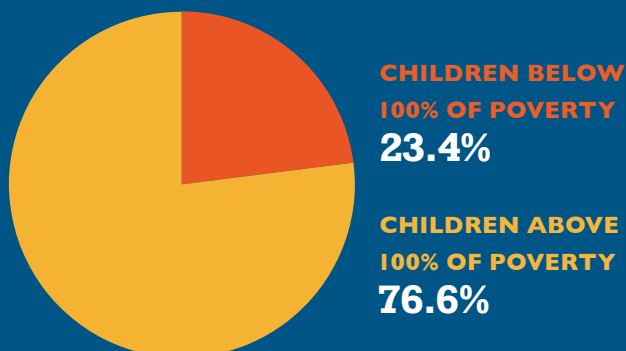

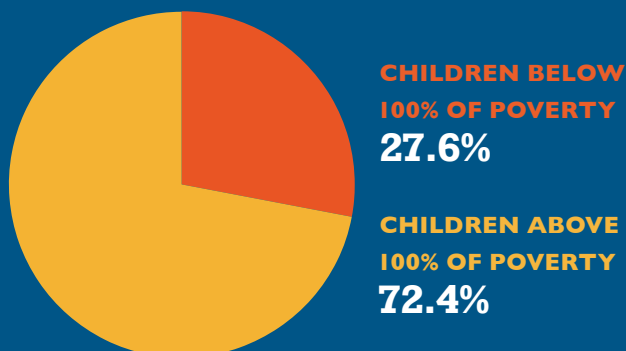

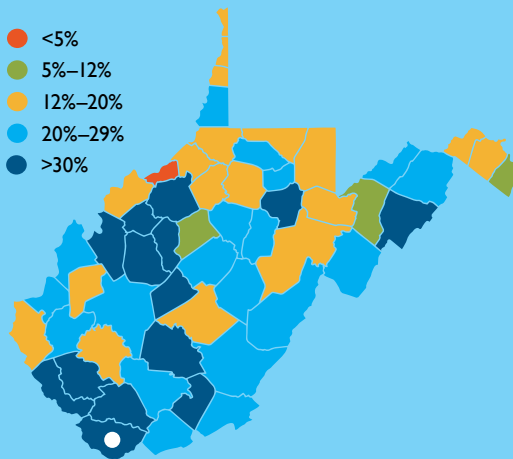

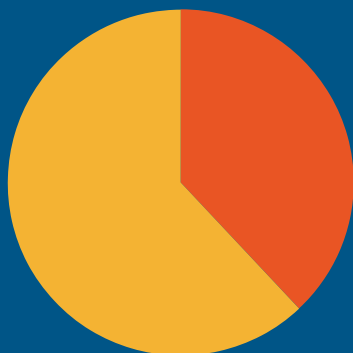

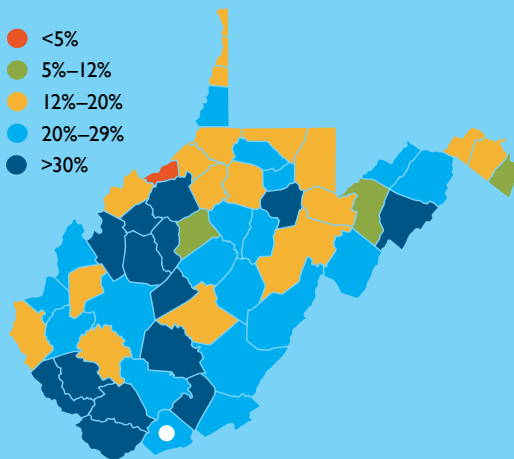

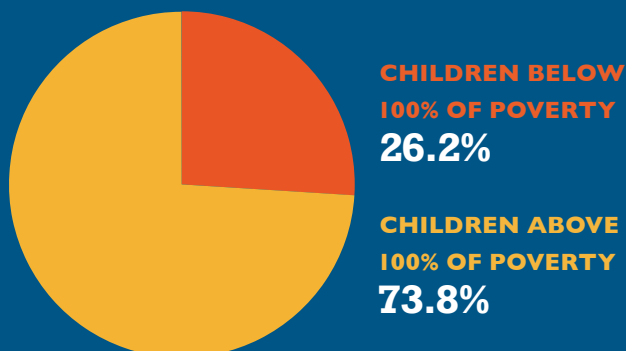

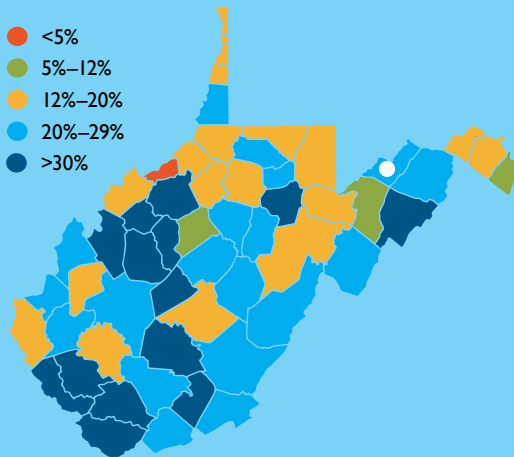

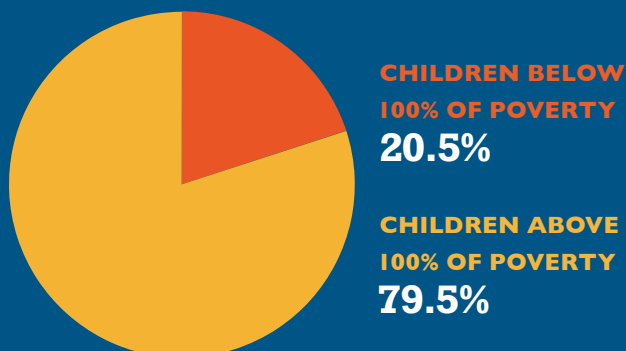

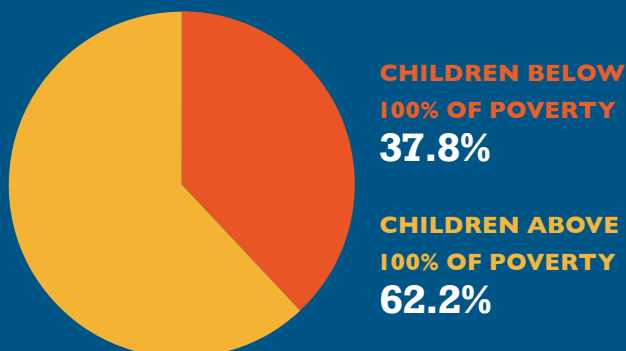

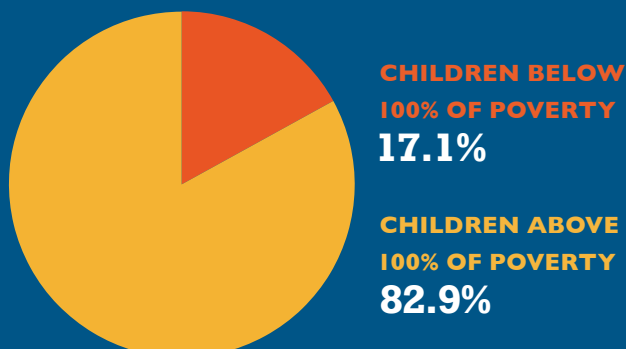

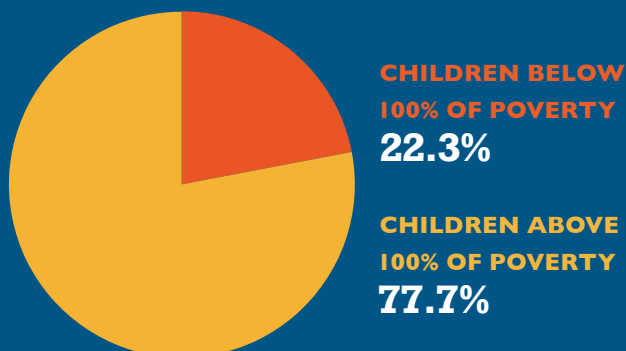

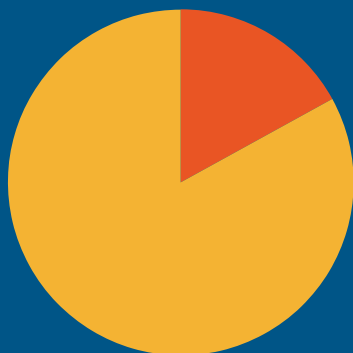

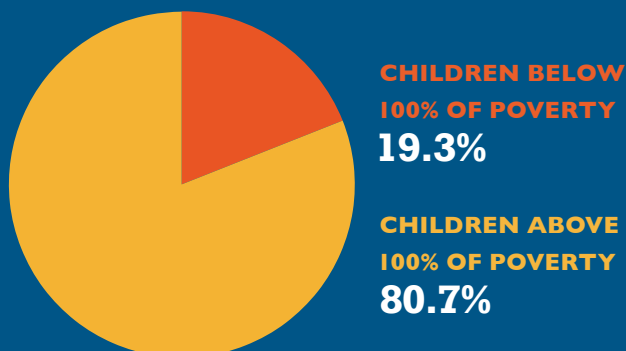

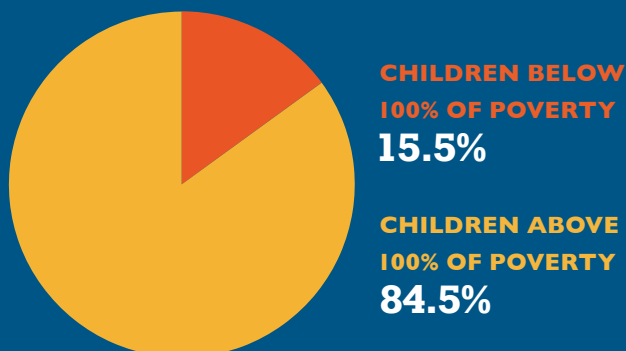

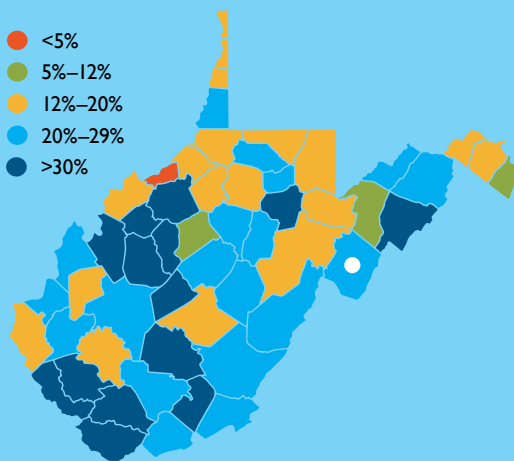

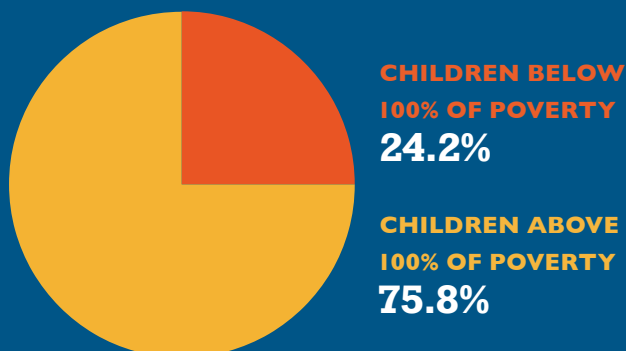

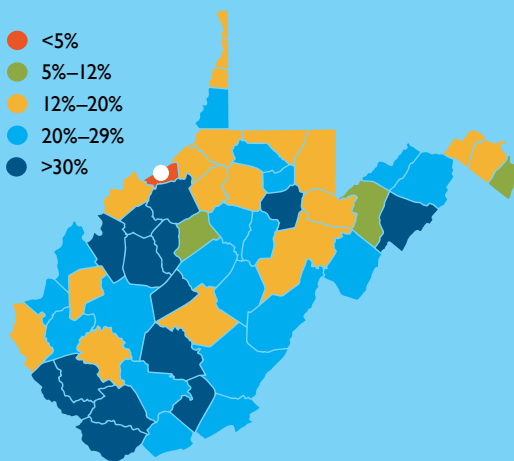

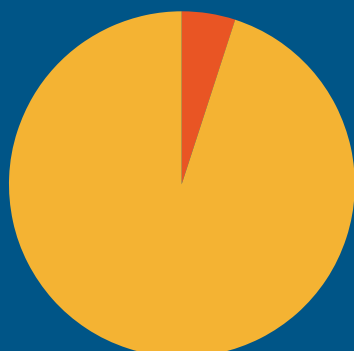

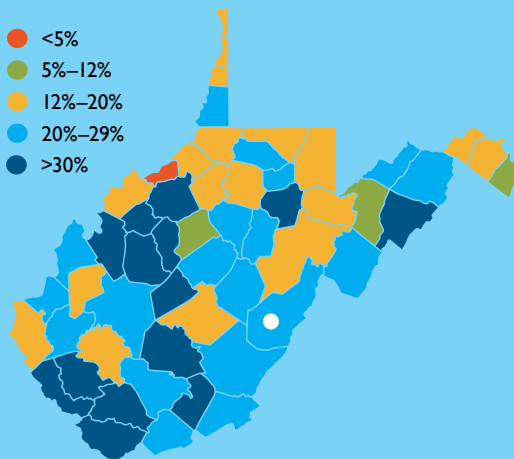

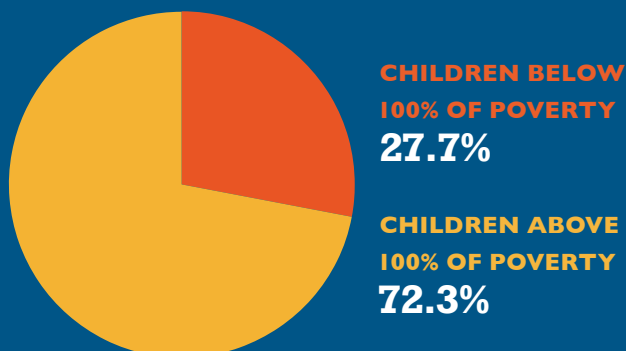

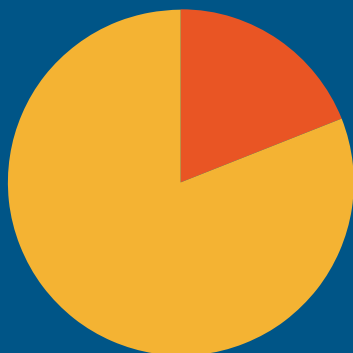

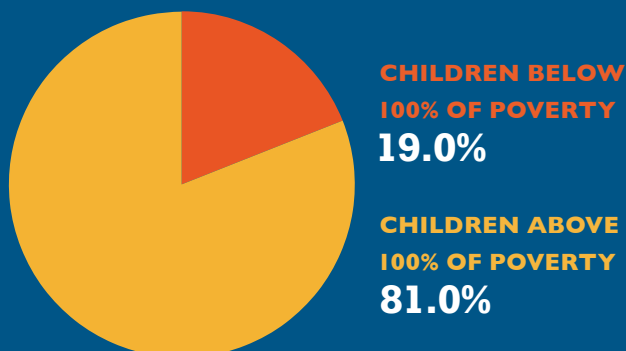

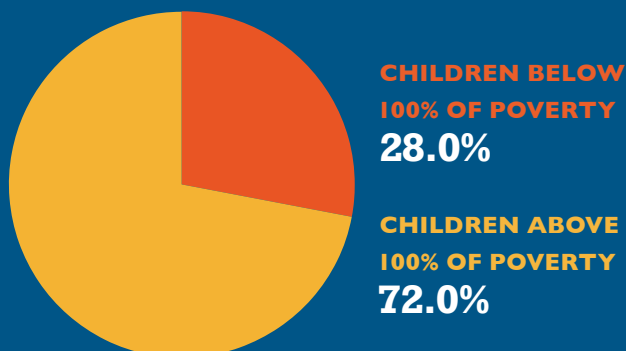

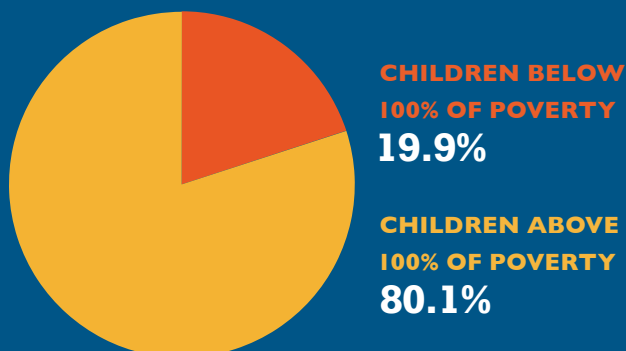

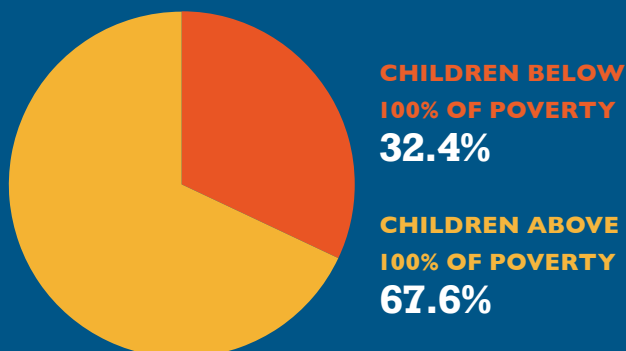

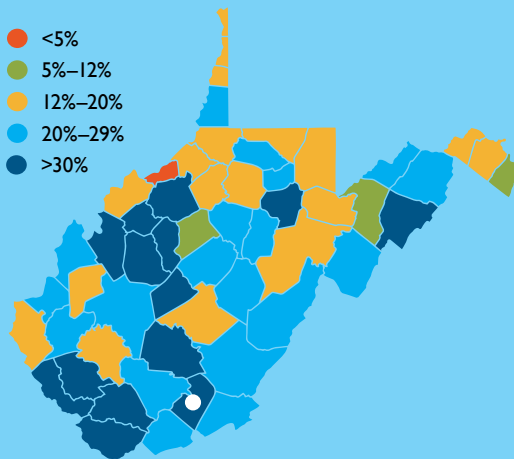

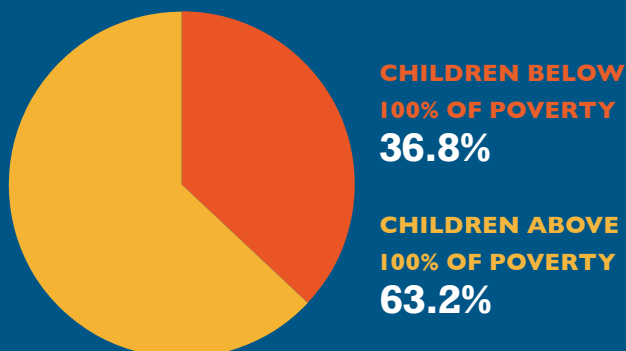

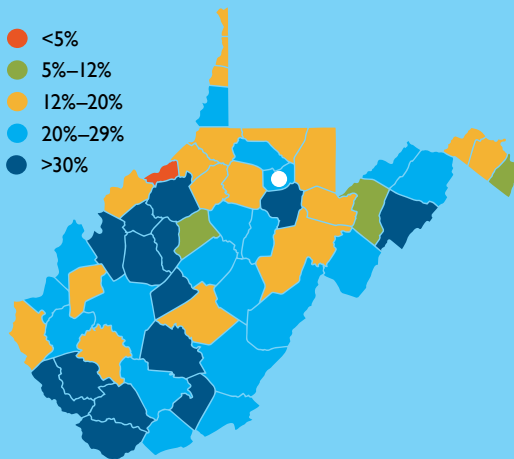

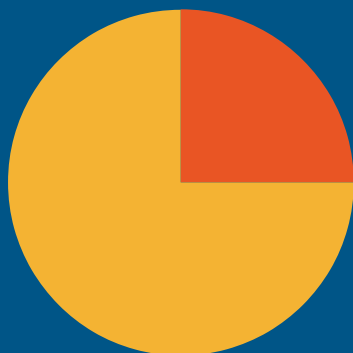

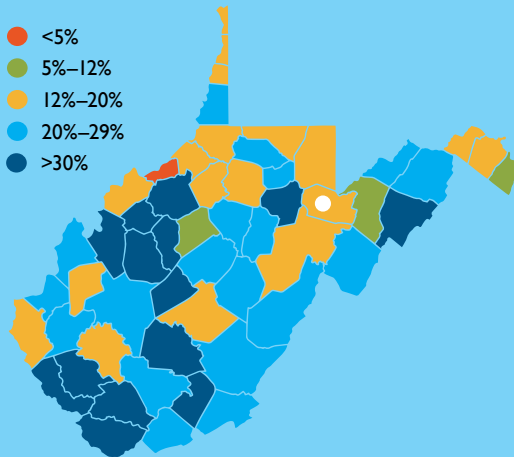

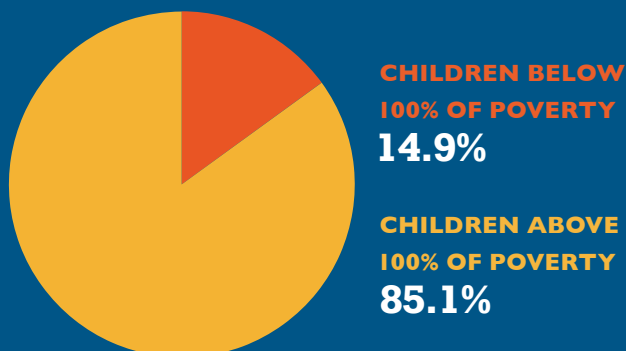

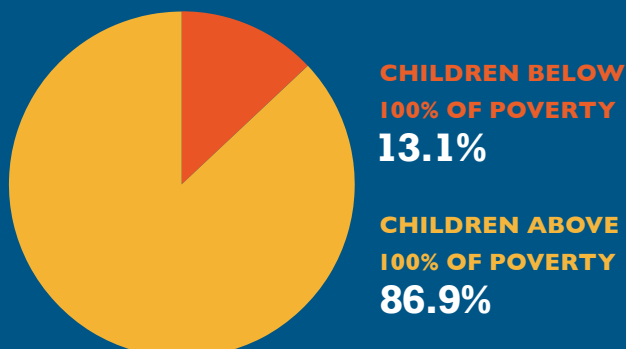

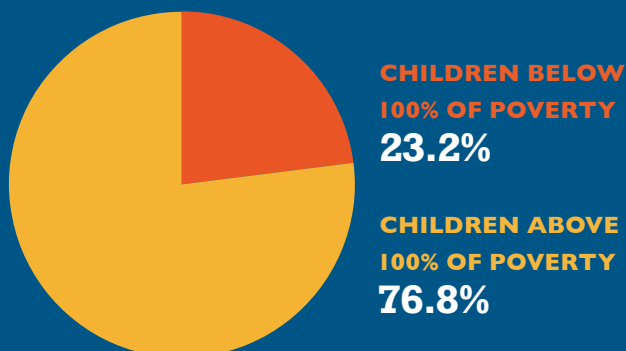

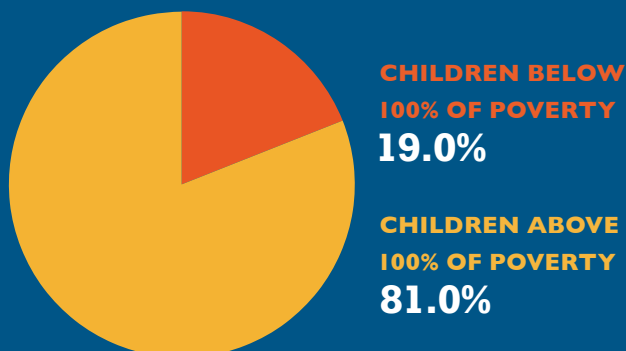

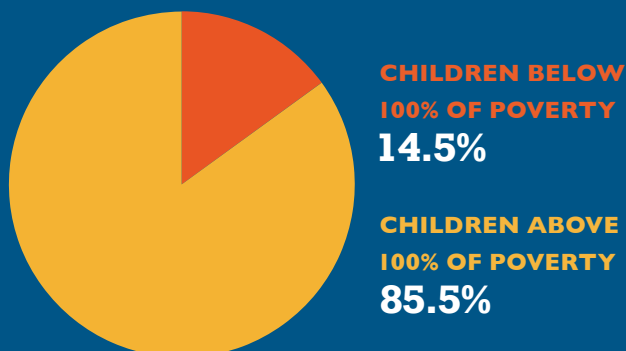

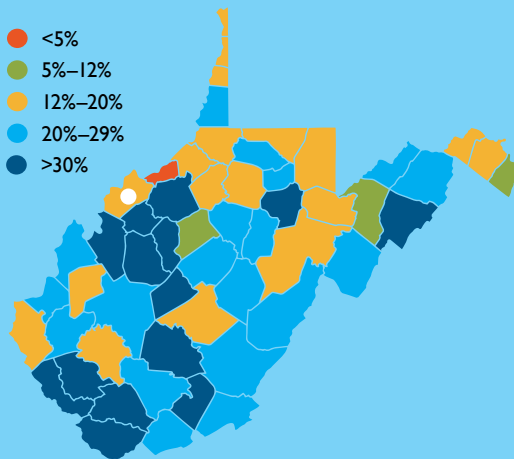

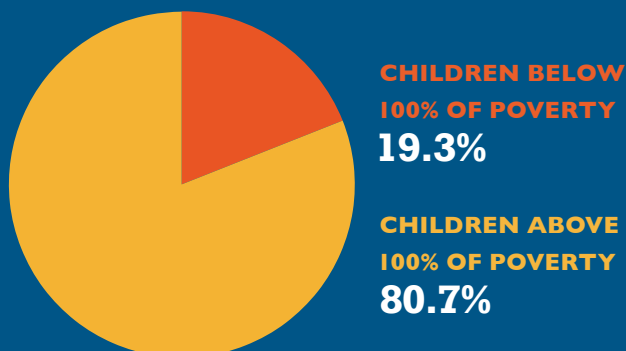

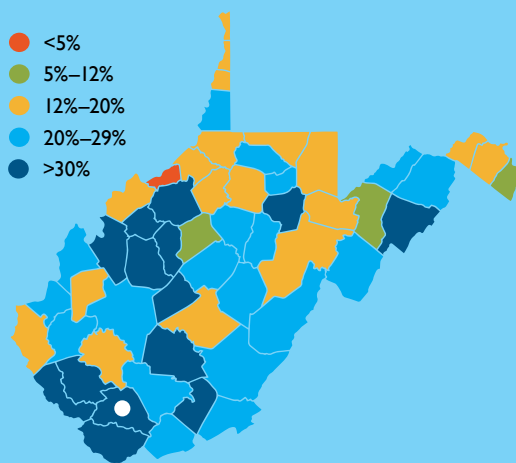

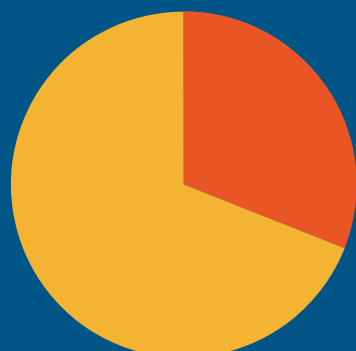
